Dance is deeply embedded into black culture by tradition. Two sorts of dance evolved as cultures developed: social dances on occasions that celebrated births, commemorated deaths, and marked special events in between; and magical or religious dances to ask the gods to end a famine, to provide rain, or to cure the sick. As the dance migrated to the Caribbean it was often seen as a form of celebration.

At St Cyprians we are celebrating Black history with African Dance.

African Dance workshop overview

Twist, turn, jump and crawl! Learn how to move your body to the energetic beats of the African Drums. Join us as we dive into the heart of Africa!

The children will learn about African Harvest, Tribes and Culture in this vibrant, dance-infused narrative. What makes African dance? How is Africa dance used today? Are there different styles of dance across Africa?

In these loud and exciting African dance workshops, children are given the chance to explore an African dance and experience the sound of the African drums and bells. Some children will learn and create a full African routine, having a huge amount of fun in the process. Choose an African animal mask or headdress, become your character and bring African Culture into your school hall!

Pupils gain inspiration from African society, creating characters and narrative through movement and gesture. They will work individually, with partners and in small groups.
