Indus Valley Seals

Over 3500 seals dating back to the Indus Valley civilisation have been found.

These seals are thought to have been used as stamps for people to mark their goods or to show they had paid the correct taxes.

I think the seals are really pretty.

The seals help us to understand how the people might have traded with other civilisations and where they travelled.

The stamps are mostly made from soapstone.

The river Indus runs through the Indus Valley.

The stamps could be pressed into clay to make an impression and then used as a tag to label an object.

They are about 3cm square and many show pictures of animals and people.

They were used as tiles to decorate bathrooms.

The seals have been found in many places, showing that the Indus Valley civilisation covered a huge area.

The seals may have helped us to learn about the types of clothes that were worn and what animals were kept.

The seals tells us how many people owned a house.




