

The Goodbye Game

Adult Guidance

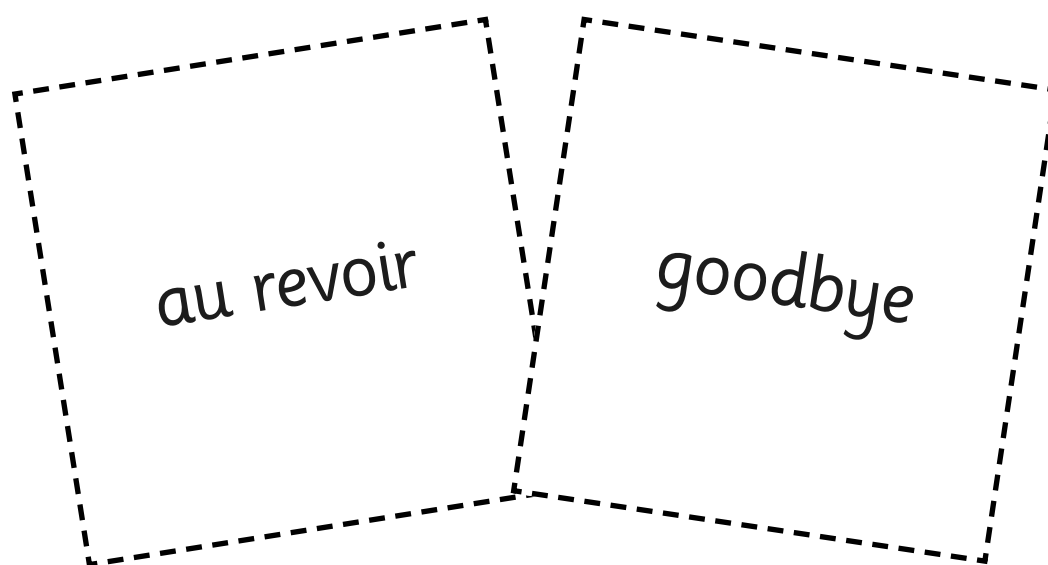
These cards can be used in several ways to practise the language of saying goodbye.

As a whole class

1. Give out word cards with the French 'goodbye' language on, one per child. Call out an English phrase. Children who have the appropriate phrase in French hold up their cards and say the phrase. Every few minutes, call out *Changez vos cartes!* [change your cards] so they have the chance to use all the different phrases.
2. Give out word cards with the French 'goodbye' language on, one per child. Describe a situation (eg. 'You're leaving school at the end of Monday afternoon.' Or 'Grandma is getting in her car to go home. You see her regularly.') and challenge children to respond appropriately by holding up their card and saying the French phrase. Every few minutes, call out *Changez vos cartes!* [change your cards] so they have the chance to use all the different phrases.
3. Play a version of 'duck, duck, goose'. Children sit in a large circle. One child is 'it' goes around the outside of the ring, touching each person's head as they pass, saying *Bonjour*, until at some point they say a 'goodbye' expression. The child they tapped jumps up and chases 'it' round the circle, trying to catch him/her before they get back to the empty space.

In groups or pairs

Make several sets of the word cards in French and English. Shuffle and deal out between 2-3 children. Play a game of *bataille* [snap].
