How are you?

How are you?

-Είμαι (πολύ) καλά. Ευχαριστώ. Εσύ; / Εσείς;

- Εέμε (poleé) kalá. Efharistó. Eseé? (one person) / Eseés (more than one)?

- I am (very) well. Thank you. How about you?

- Δεν είμαι καλά. Ευχαριστώ. Εσύ; / Εσείς;

- Then eéme kalá. Efharistó. Eseé (one person)? /Eseés (more than one)?

- I am not very well. Thank you. How about you?

- Είμαι έτσι κι έτσι. Ευχαριστώ. Εσύ; / Εσείς;
- Εέμε έτsee κι έτsee. Efharistó. Eseé (one person)? / Eseés (more than one?)
- I am so and so. Thank you. How about you?

B Τι κάνετε;	Tee kánete?	How are you? (when speaking to more than one person or to an adult to show respect)
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- Είμαι / Είμαστε ... Ευχαριστώ / Ευχαριστούμε.
- Εέμε / Εémaste ... Efharistó / Efharistoóme.
- I am / We are ... Thank you. / We thank you. (all answers same as above)

C Είσαι καλά;	Eése kalá?	Are you ok?
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- Ναι, είμαι καλά. - Ne, eéme kalá. - Yes, I am well.
- Όχι, δεν είμαι καλά. - 'Ochi, den eéme kalá. - No, I am not well.
- Είμαι έτσι κι έτσι. - Εέμε έτsee kee έτsee. - I am so and so.
