

WALT: Form plurals using 's' and 'es'.


WILF: I understand that 'singular' means 'one'. I understand that 'plural' means more than one. I can change nouns from singular to plural by adding 's' or 'es'.



Plural means 'more than one'.



Singular = 1

Plural = more than 1

One door




Lots of door**s**

Lots of lamp**s**


There are lots of rules when changing words from singular to plural.

BE CAREFUL!


We are going to look at just two of the rules.

For most words we just add 's' to the end of it to change it into a plural.

one pear



three pears



desk → desk**s**

month → month**s**

book → book**s**

train → train**s**

pen → pen**s**

dog → dog**s**

If the word ends with one of these sounds...

sh

ch

ss

s



...then add **'es'**

To change these words in to plurals, add 'es'.

two brushes




