Every week MPs receive lots of emails, phone calls and letters from people who want to ask questions or find out more about something. They try and answer them all – with some help of course!


Anyone can contact their local MP. What do you really care about and would like to ask your MP about?

Activity 2: Write to Your MP




You can contact your local MP too! If there is an issue you care about or something you'd like to see changed, your MP can try to help that happen.
